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Bronze 2 example SOW - Not mandatory, adjust to meet your own context but ensure learning outcomes can be evidenced through the assessment criteria linked to the activities.

Try to build progressively on Bronze 1 work. This SOW assumes presentation of work will be in web pages. Again this is not mandatory and you can substitute a WP document or a desktop presentation but building skills in using web applications will help later with Web Software and Using Collaborative Technologies units. There is also an EU wide and government policy for e-portfolios and we are starting early here in developing the appropriate skills and knowledge to enable learners to do this.

Activity 1:- Using the web to find information

Contributing activities:

- Logging on and starting the web browser
- Searching for information (what key words work best?)
- Discussing the information found with friends

Activity 2:- Organising information

Contributing activities:

Activity 9:- Endangered Species, organising information part 1

- Project challenge. Find five endangered animals get pictures of each that are licensed to share and find out how many are left in the world

- Learn how to put images and text into cells in a web table

Activity 11 :- How do my web pages work?
